Comments relating to RAM'S PEAK/.SCOTT'S WELL Trail
Route ID Numbers **HN182, HN 182A, HN183**

Dear Sirs,

I am opposed to the closing of HN 182A, a cut across on Ram's Peak/Scott's Well Trail and to the closing of HN 182 & 183, two adjacent routes located in the Havasu BLM Unit. This is trail approximately 30 miles long, (entry is of Franconia Wash exit on I-40 and exit at Havasu Heights).**HN182A shows up on Map C as closed, but as open on Map D. I SUPPORT MAP D**

HN 182A saves an estimated three miles of extra or repeat driving. Closing it would necessitate going back down HN186 from Scott's Well, turning west on HM177. Turning south on HN721 where you would intersect with the HN182 cut across exit and continuing south on HN 181 to Ram's Peak. The use of the cut across would save repeated travel on these trails. HN 182 and HN 183 are two trails that go from Scott's Well to Ram's Peak.

In closing, I reaffirm these routes, (HN 182, HN 182A, HN 183) AS SHOWN ON MAP should be left open as shown on Map D
